We have one new member recruited from a strong women exercise class.


We are planning on attending state meeting this year. Our new member also plans to attend.





President Joy Flake, who is also the Blood Drive Chair, was presented the award in April, 2014.


Mercy Auxiliary – Berryville is pleased to announce the following Scholarship awards:

In May we are having a Technology fundraiser. We'll let you know how it goes as this will be our first of this type.


