Please take the time to thank our legislators who voted for SB 101, which houses the appropriation for the Arkansas Private Option and for SB 96. Our hospitals mean very much to all of us as they provide a place for treatment when we need it. Can you imagine what it would be if we had to drive a great distance to obtain this. In many cases immediate treatment means the saving of a life.

In signing SB 96, Governor Hutchinson will create the Arkansas Health Reform Task Force to study the entire Arkansas Medicaid program. Our hospitals are very interested in the Task Force's work and will do all they can to be helpful as it studies the entire Medicaid program and begins to make recommendations on ways for the program to better serve Arkansans. Bo Ryall, AHA President and CEO, has indicated that he may need our help as the task force moves forward. I assured him that we will do all that we can to help in this matter.

I am looking forward to seeing all of you at the district meetings in April. You are to be commended for the planning, preparation, and putting on great meetings. In addition to seeing you, I am always delighted to learn of the work you are doing in your respective communities for your hospitals.

Let me close with this thought from Danny Thomas: "Success is not built on what we accomplish for ourselves. Its foundation lies in what we do for others."



The private option was Arkansas's unique answer to the Affordable Care Act's option to extend coverage to lower-income adults beyond the state's current Medicaid eligibility. She further stated that Private Option is in effect an expanded Medicaid program that allows federal dollars to be spent for Blue Cross/Blue Shield coverage to pay for medical coverage. This means under the plan, there is a greater chance for hospitals to be paid for patients who have no insurance. Immediately following the presentation, Auxilians were asked to make contact with state legislators. Members wrote post cards to state lawmakers urging their support for continuation of the Private Option.

Written by State Representative Sheila Lampkin, District 9, who is also a member of our local Drew Memorial Hospital Auxiliary.

We would ask for your continued support of the Private Option healthcare system for the working poor. Governor Hutchinson has decided he will support continuing to support it until the end of 2016 in order to have time to further investigate it in order to study how it can be made better, tightened up or abandoned for a new or renamed system. He found it difficult to just drop over 200,000 Arkansans who had never had insurance before. It's also hard to just drop a system that has been so helpful in easing the debt loads of our hospitals. He is hoping to come up with a better plan.

In the meantime his own party, or a certain segment of them, disagree and just want it gone. It seems to be partly the age old problem of the have versus the have-nots.

Regardless, his nephew, Jim Hendren, introduced a bill to keep the Private Option until December 2016, *and* create a Task Force to study the PO for a better plan or further "tweaks." At least sick people and hospitals have nearly two years of "grace." Hendren's bill passed the Senate and will be introduced on the House this week. Pray for Arkansas!

Our state organization, the Arkansas Hospital Association, stands by the Private Option as a means of serving the ill and saving our hospitals. Our own DMH's uncompensated debt load has been eased greatly and CEO Scott Barilleaux supports its passage.

How can you help? Contact your legislators, or legislators you know, and encourage them to support Sen. Hendren's bill and give the Private Option a longer chance to prove its effectiveness. We shouldn't throw out the baby with the bath water.

A fast-moving Private Option measure, that calls for the program's end by 2016 instead of 2015 and would create a task force to put together larger health care reforms, heads to a key House committee after its passage in the Senate.

Attempts to shorten the Private Option to the end of 2015 have failed at both ends of the capitol leaving many observers to speculate that the 2016 bill, supported by Hutchinson, will likely pass the House.


President Joy Flake and Gift Shop Chair Joyce McMullen attended "The Market" in Dallas, Texas.



Also, in April we will vote on new officers, treat our Nurses and present 3 scholarships.




