The auxiliary also purchased twenty-five (25) Rounding Boards for the hospital. They will be placed in the patient rooms on 2-North and in ICU. These boards will let the patient know when someone has been in to check on them. Aimee Arzoumanian was a guest speaker at our June meeting. She spoke to us as to how much the Rounding Boards have helped the patients to know that someone is checking on them at frequent intervals. Since the start of using the Rounding Boards, the hospital’s HCAHPS scores have been going up.
