62nd AHAA BUSINESS MEETING VIA TELECONFERENCE October 8, 2020

The 62nd annual Business Meeting was called to order at 10:00 am on October 8, 2020 via teleconference by AHAA President Jan Gardner.

Jerry Berley from Quachita County Medical Center, Warren, gave the invocation.

Judy Shaffer, AHAA Secretary, took roll call. The minutes of the 2020 annual meeting were approved as written. Jan Gardner has appointed three members to approve the 2020 annual meeting minutes. They are Freddie Lipton of Bradley County Medical Center, Pud Thomas, South Mississippi County Regional Medical Center and Sharon Sly, Siloam Springs Regional Hospital. The minutes will be printed in the November/December AHAA newsletter.

Ara Yanker, Treasurer, gave the annual financial report and it will be filed for audit. Ara then presented the proposed 2020-2021 AHAA Budget, Carol Evans, North Arkansas Regional Medical Center, made a motion to accept the 2020-2021 budget as presented. Ginny Presgrove, Northeast Baptist Memorial Hospital, seconded the motion. Motion passed. The annual financial report can be found on page 19 of the 2020-2021 State handbook and the 2020-2021 budget can be found on page 5 of the State handbook.

Bylaws Chair Mary Frauenhoff presented the bylaw changes: Emergency Telephonic Conferences can be found on page 41 of the 2020-2021 handbook: Under Article VI. Officers, Section 2 will be amended as follows: Only elected officers, as listed in Section 1 above, as well as **the Immediate**Past President, AHA President and the Arkansas Society of Directors of Volunteer Services (ASDVS) President shall have a vote on motions made at AHAA board meetings.

The memorials will be published in the November/December newsletter. The memorials for this year will be included in the 2021 Convention as well.

Jan stated that every hospital will receive a 5-Star Award for Excellence. The Certificates have been signed and will be sent to the District Chairs for distribution.

Mr. Webb's grandmothers were both volunteers at White County Medical Center; therefore, he has personally seen the impact serving others has on volunteers' lives. Both grandmothers have passed away, one just this last December. At the visitation and funeral, Mr. Webb and his family recalled how much she truly enjoyed her time volunteering; how much the friendships she made meant to her.

At the Awards Luncheon held in June, Mr. Webb recognized the significance of the awards presented. He acknowledged every hour served and the considerable impact each has on our hospital and community.

Because the volunteers are very close to his heart, it is important that he communicate with them regularly. Last September, he attended the General Business meeting and gave a full report on the system: growth, accomplishments and challenges. He answered questions and advised on how volunteers can influence our vision's success.

Mr. Webb is personable, outgoing and enjoys clowning around with our volunteers. At our Christmas Party, Mr. Webb and the Auxiliary Board of Directors performed surprise entertainment – a mock water ballet routine. After several hours of secretly planning and practicing around schedules and limitations, all who attended enjoyed the gut-busting routine.

Who knew in the months to follow, a deadly pandemic would totally dismantle our country. As soon as it was known that Covid-19 posed increased threat to our volunteer family, Mr. Webb called a meeting with the Leadership Team and the Director of Volunteer Services. After lengthy discussion, the decision was made to educate and send all volunteers home immediately. The Auxiliary President and DVS were called to meet with Mr. Webb so that he could tell her directly of the volunteer safety plan. Over the next several weeks, volunteers were called to work from home by making masks and isolation gowns to subsidize PPE inventory. Volunteers also safely served by transporting specimens to a lab in Memphis.

To keep lines of communication open with volunteers, a private Unity Health Volunteer Facebook page was made. Videos are posted from Mr. Webb and other UH leaders giving stats and updates several times per week. Additionally, information is passed along thru the monthly Auxiliary Newsletter.

At this time, the return of volunteers is a topic of discussion in weekly meetings held by UH Leadership. "The health and well-being of our volunteer family is too important to make lax decisions when so much is still unknown," stated Mr. Webb. We are grateful for his heartfelt leadership.

W. P. ROCKEFELLER CANCER INSTITUTE Jane T. Lowe

On Monday, October 26, a steam pipe burst in the UAMS Winthrop P. Rockefeller Cancer Institute causing flooding and damage on three floors. The auxiliary gift shop and volunteer office had damage and flooding. The volunteer workroom will have to have a new wall. Although most of the merchandise in the gift shop was saved, walls and some of the ceiling as well will have to be replaced. At this point it is not known how long the shop will be closed. Hopefully, it will be back in business soon.

The Winthrop P. Rockefeller Cancer Institute is hopeful that volunteers will be able to return before the end of the year. Traditionally, volunteers must attend a mandatory volunteer inservice each year. These are held in October. This year, due to the Pandemic, the inservices are being held via Zoom. The first one was October 14. Another Zoom in-service will be held in mid-November. Volunteers must attend either one of the Zoom in-services or do on-line training. Thirty-three volunteers participated in the first Zoom in-service and enjoyed seeing each other.

The Winthrop P. Rockefeller Cancer Institute Auxiliary Partners Card project is October 30 – November 8. For a 10 day period those who have purchased a \$50 card get a 20% discount at almost 200 participating stores and restaurants in Conway, central and northwest Arkansas. The proceeds from the sale of the Partners Cards are directed to the WPRCI Auxiliary to support UAMS programs for cancer patients throughout Arkansas. Partners Card began in 2004 and has raised almost \$1.5 million.

New blankets will be distributed to Winthrop P. Rockefeller Cancer Institute patients during the month of December. These blankets have been made by volunteers or purchased by auxiliary members and friends.

Bows and a tip of the hat to all those involved with staffing the Pink-A-Dilly and our Bargain Boxes!! We are generating near record sales since we have resumed operations. All of the shops have had volunteers step up and take on extra shifts to keep the doors open. All protocol regarding Safe Practices are being fully implemented that includes social distancing, wearing of masks and continual sanitizing. Our public has willingly accepted shopping in our new environment and is clearly actively supporting each of our venues. We recently accepted a new volunteer who utilized the Bargain Box in Flippin for his attire to prom several years ago. He now is working full time job and plans to help on Saturdays at the Bargain Box.

To date combined sales since January 2020 is in excess of \$282,000.00. This revenue is so significant considering the past disruption. We want to thank all of our volunteers using their time in the shops! You are doing remarkable work in challenging times

In the development stages our BRMC Marketing Department are hard at work preparing volunteer recruitment brochures that will be available in both print and electronic formats. In conjunction with the brochures, standalone banners will be strategically positioned in the waiting areas promoting interest in our BRMC Auxiliary Mission.

At our August Board Meeting our Barney Larry announced that even with the Stock Market undergoing lean periods our endowment not only maintained but grew!

As a result Barney informed us that our Auxiliary was to receive \$100,000.00 from earnings. This is a most welcome development considering that during our store closures our revenue had been adversely effect. Combining this news with exciting current sales figures we are well prepared to face upcoming requirements and challenges!

We were recently called upon and responded to critical needs of our Hospital with the purchasing of Ultraviolet Robotic Units that are capable of sterilizing hospital rooms in minutes while being unattended. Your auxiliary donated \$60,000 towards the purchase of that unit.

Once again, our Auxiliary has made a significant difference in which all should take pride! Each of us, in our separate roles, clearly has such a meaningful impact on our Hospital's continued development and growth!

Justin Woods from the Baxter Regional Foundation Office shared at the Auxiliary Board Meeting in September about the capital campaign to purchase 2 new ambulances. Your auxiliary board voted to donate \$50,000 towards the purchase of these ambulances.

Excitement and anticipation is growing as our Surgical Center has taken form and the size and scope is clearly visible to all. This state-of-the-art facility will be ranked as the most advanced in the State and completion date is anticipated to be in January 2021. This will significantly increase our Hospital's capacity and capabilities.


